Evening Tour #1

**Seattle City Lights  
Dinner and Deluxe City Tour  
Sunday, June 6  
6:30pm – 10:00pm**

Start the evening with a 3-course dinner at Ivar’s Salmon House, a beautiful cedar replica of a Northwest Indian Longhouse, complete with an open-pit Indian-style barbecue. In a setting filled with Northwest native artifacts and historical photographs, you’ll enjoy a memorable meal surrounded by spectacular views of boats cruising on Lake Union with the city skyline in the background.

Following dinner, board the bus for an evening tour of the city that gives visitors not only an overview of Seattle, but also a “sense of its heart”.

Drive along the waterfront with its import shops and fresh seafood restaurants, into historic Pioneer Square. One of Seattle’s oldest neighborhoods, it features early 1900’s architecture, much of which has been renovated into galleries and shops. Next is a trip through the International district, the third largest on the West Coast, where evidence of the Pacific Rim cultural influence abounds. Even the streetlights have an Asian style.

The first stop will be the Hiram Chittenden Locks and Salmon Ladder. The locks are an engineering feat which connect saltwater Puget Sound with freshwater Lake Union. During seasonal migration, the Salmon Ladder allows the fish to swim upstream to reach their parent streams to spawn. A visit to Seattle wouldn’t be complete without gazing at the spectacular views of Seattle, Mt. Rainier, Puget Sound, and the Olympic Mountains from Magnolia Bluff. The final stop on the tour will be the famous Pike Place Market, the oldest farmers’ market in the country, noted for its “fish tossing” vendors. \*  
\*Number of stops may be adjusted based on departure time from restaurant.

A trip to Seattle wouldn’t be complete without a ride on the monorail and a visit to the Space Needle. So ASNR has arranged for attendees to experience both of these unique Seattle attractions in a very special evening.

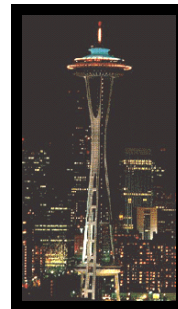
What could be a more appropriate way to travel to the Space Needle than on the futuristic appearing Seattle Center Monorail. The nation’s first full-scale commercial monorail system, it provides a fun, quick and convenient link from downtown Seattle to the host of sports, cultural and shopping attractions at the Seattle Center. Upon arrival at the Space Needle, you’ll be whisked to a private dining room on the SkyLine Level. Located at the 100-foot level, the whole Northwest will be at your feet. As you look out on one of the most magnificent views in the world, savor a 3-course meal of distinctive Pacific Northwest cuisine with many of the raw ingredients coming right from the neighborhood.

Following dinner, travel up to the observation deck that sits atop this 605-foot Seattle monument to take in the 360° view that includes such awe-inspiring sites as snow-capped Mt. Rainier to the south, the Cascade Mountains to the east, the majestic Olympics to the west, beautiful Lake Washington, and the vast Puget Sound.
