Membership Categories and Criteria

Senior Member:

1. Shall be a radiologist certified by the *American Board of Radiology*, *The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC)*, *The American Osteopathic College of Radiology*, or other Board or Tribunal which, in the judgment of the Executive Committee, is of equivalent rank.
2. Shall have completed **one** of the following criteria:
 - a) 2 years of Neuroradiology fellowship training under the supervision of a *Senior* member in an institution with an ACGME or RCPSC-accredited radiology residency program **OR**
 - b) 1 year of fellowship training in Neuroradiology (*not to have begun until 18 months after the beginning of radiology residency*), and a second year of experience primarily (>90%) in Neuroradiology, and/or subspecialized area of Neuroradiology, under the supervision of a *Senior* member in an institution with an ACGME or RCPSC-accredited radiology residency program **OR**
 - c) 1 year of fellowship training in Neuroradiology under the supervision of a *Senior* member in an institution with an ACGME or RCPSC-accredited radiology residency program, **and** 3 years of subsequent radiology practice during which 50% of the practice time is documented in Neuroradiology **OR**
 - d) Subspecialty Certification (formerly CAQ) in Neuroradiology (from 1994 through 2004), **and** 4 years of subsequent radiology practice during which 50% of the practice time is documented in Neuroradiology.
3. Shall be engaged in active practice of Neuroradiology and/or a subspecialty of Neuroradiology in North America, devoting at least one-half time (exclusive of administrative duties) to the professional practice of Neuroradiology.

Member: Shall be other neuroradiologists, radiologists, or physicians with an interest in Neuroradiology, who may not fulfill the requirements for *Senior* membership.

Research Scientist: Shall be a physicist (PhD) or neuroscientist (MS, PhD) with an interest in and/or position relevant to Neuroradiology or Radiology, and who may not fulfill the requirements for *Senior* membership.

Member-in-Training: Shall be a physician in an ACGME or RCPSC-accredited Neuroradiology fellowship program.

Instructions for Application

1. Read the application and candidate requirements *carefully* before completing the application.
2. Incomplete applications, or those that do not include all the required documents, cannot be processed.
3. **Assemble all documents in the order listed below, and place a check or credit card information for prorated membership dues (which already include the full application fee) on top of the application package.**

Senior candidates:

1. Prorated membership dues including the \$100 application fee *
2. Completed application
3. Copy of Radiology Board or Subspecialty Certificate in Neuroradiology (formerly CAQ)
4. Current C/V

Applicants for *Senior* membership who have Subspecialty Certification in Neuroradiology and/or have completed an ACGME or RCPSC-accredited Neuroradiology fellowship do not require written sponsorship.

Member candidates:

1. Prorated membership dues including the \$25 application fee *
2. Completed application
3. Sponsor Forms (signed) from 2 ASNR *Senior* members (current or former *Members-in-Training* do not require sponsors)
4. If applying on the basis of Subspecialty Certification (formerly CAQ), include a copy of the Subspecialty certificate
5. Current C/V

Research Scientist candidates:

1. The application fee and membership dues have been waived for the first two years
2. Completed application
3. Sponsor Forms (signed) from 2 ASNR *Senior* or *Research Scientist* members

Member-in-Training candidates:

1. The application fee and membership dues have been waived during Neuroradiology fellowship (2-year maximum)
2. Completed application, signed by the Neuroradiology Program Director

Awards and Neuroradiology Education and Research (NER) Foundation Fellowships

- **Gold Medal Award ...** fosters the highest standards of the ASNR, based on exceptional quality, service, and excellence. It emphasizes both professional and personal attributes...individuals who are superb neuroradiologists and/or scientists, and are also truly outstanding people. The recipients are individuals who have extended themselves beyond furthering their own careers, through contributions at all levels of the professional strata, with an accent on consistency and duration of these outstanding contributions. Presentation of the Gold Medal is made before the membership at the Society's Annual Meeting.
- **Cornelius G. Dyke Memorial Award ...** was established in 1971 to honor the late Cornelius G. Dyke, one of the pioneers in Neuroradiology. It is available to radiology fellows or junior faculty (assistant professor level or below). This recognition is awarded to an individual based on careful review of the submitted work by the Research Committee. The award offers an opportunity to have one's work presented to the membership at the Annual Meeting, and possibly, published in the *American Journal of Neuroradiology*. It provides the recipient with an honorarium, complimentary Annual Meeting registration, hotel, and transportation.
- **ASNR Outstanding Presentation Awards ...** are selected each year at the Annual Meeting by the Education Committee and representatives from the allied specialty societies from the best papers or posters in *Functional, Pediatrics, Spine, Interventional, Head and Neck, and General Neuroradiology*. An additional award in *General Neuroradiology* is sponsored by Bayer HealthCare Pharmaceuticals.
- **Bayer/NER Foundation Fellowship in Basic Science Research ...** first awarded in 1986. It was created by the ASNR with the support of Bayer HealthCare Pharmaceuticals (formerly Berlex) to stimulate the scientific development of promising individuals, and to aid them in embarking on a career in academic Neuroradiology. It is specifically designed to provide educational opportunities for young radiologists who are not yet professionally established in the neuroradiologic sciences, to gain further insight into scientific investigation, and to develop competence in research. Recipients receive a generous stipend.
- **NER Foundation/Boston Scientific Fellowship in Cerebrovascular Disease Research...** was created to provide an opportunity for a young neuroradiologist to pursue research in a topic that will advance the diagnosis and treatment of cerebrovascular disease. Recipients receive a generous stipend.
- **NER Foundation Scholar Award in Neuroradiology Research ...** initially awarded in 1998. It was created for young investigators in the early phase of their careers, to enhance their competency in areas important to the future of Neuroradiology, including health services research, physiological imaging and interventional neuroradiology. Recipients receive a generous grant, including fringe benefits.
