

Membership Categories

Senior Member: Shall be certified by the American Board of Radiology, Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC), The American Osteopathic College of Radiology, or other Board or Tribunal which, in the judgment of the Executive Committee, is of equivalent rank. Shall have completed a one year ACGME-or RCPSC-approved fellowship program in Neuroradiology, passage of the ABR Subspecialty Certification exam in Neuroradiology, and engaged in the active practice of Neuroradiology and/or a subspecialty of Neuroradiology in North America devoting at least 50% (exclusive of administrative duties) to the professional practice of Neuroradiology.

Senior International Member: Shall meet the criteria for *Senior* membership but who resides outside of North America.

Member: Shall be other radiologists, scientists (Master’s degree or higher ([PhD]) and physicians, including non-radiologists/clinicians with an interest in Neuroradiology, who do not meet the criteria for *Senior or Senior International* membership.

Member-in-Training: Shall be a physician in an ACGME- or RCPSC-accredited (Canadian) Radiology residency or Neuroradiology fellowship program or medical and graduate (PhD) students, or post-doctoral fellows within five years of their doctoral degree.

International Member-in-Training: residents, fellows, post-doctoral fellows within five years of their doctoral degree, medical students, or graduate (PhD) students located outside the United States and Canada.

Research Scientist: Shall be a physicist (PhD) or neuroscientist (MS, PhD) with an interest in and/or position relevant to Neuroradiology or Radiology, and who may not fulfill the requirements for *Senior or Senior International* membership.

International Outreach Member: Neuroradiologists and radiologists in developing countries with an annual GDP of \$10,000 or less.

Membership Benefits

- **Twelve issues** per year of *American Journal of Neuroradiology (AJNR)*. This peer-reviewed journal is internationally recognized as the primary source of information regarding all aspects of Neuroimaging, including head, neck, and spine imaging, for all professionals engaged in these and related fields;
- **Advocacy** for the interests of Neuroradiology regarding Coding, Reimbursement, Quality Initiatives and government policy; dissemination of pertinent coding, reimbursement and government policy information;

- **ASNR eNews** and *emailings*, providing the latest Society news and information members need to know.
- **The ASNR Annual Meeting and Foundation of the ASNR Symposium**, features presentations of scientific papers, posters, seminars, workshops, symposia, scientific exhibits, computer-assisted exhibits, “How-To Sessions,” and technical exhibits in collaboration with allied specialty societies to cover various aspects of Neuroradiology, including *Functional Neuroradiology, Head and Neck Radiology, Interventional Neuroradiology, Pediatric Neuroradiology, and Spine Radiology*. Members receive early registration notice and reduced registration fees plus the opportunity to attend the Annual Business Meeting of Members. *ASNR eCME* features Neuroradiology-related lectures on timely topics, presented, in most cases, as Real Media streaming audio presentations with slide-show accompaniment. Materials represent either original submissions created specifically for *ASNR eCME* or captured live presentations from the ASNR Annual Meeting and Foundation of the ASNR Symposium;
- **ASNR.MOC** is ASNRs portal to ABR Maintenance of Certification resources, including eCME, SAMs, and PQI;
- **Neurographics**- educational journal features the highest rated educational content from the ASNR Annual Meeting, as well as allied specialty society meetings. Several review articles per issue offer CME through ASNR’s eCME website. Journal articles are available free online from the *Neurographics* website.

- **ASNR Patient Portal** provides a patient-focused guide to neuroradiology, including a definition of neuroradiology and sub-specialty medicine, descriptions of neuroradiological procedures and descriptions of the conditions neuroradiologists treat;

ASNR Awards

- **Gold Medal** awarded on the basis of both professional and personal excellence, honoring individuals who are superb neuroradiologists, scientists, and/or physicians, and who also are truly outstanding people;
- **Honorary Member** awarded to individuals (other than those holding *Senior* or *Member* status) who have made extraordinary contributions to Neuroradiology;
- **Cornelius G. Dyke Memorial Award** given to an assistant professor, fellow or resident for excellence as demonstrated in a paper, which represents original, unpublished research in some aspect of Neuroradiology;
- **Outstanding Presentation Awards** selected at the Annual Meeting by the ASNR Education Committee and representatives from the allied specialty societies for best paper or poster presentation in *Functional, Head and Neck, Interventional, Pediatrics, Spine, and General Neuroradiology*. The Foundation of the ASNR sponsors one of the two awards given in General Neuroradiology;
- **Trainee Award** selected at the Annual Meeting by the ASNR Fellowship Director's Committee for the best paper presentation by a fellow, resident, or medical student.

The Foundation of the ASNR Awards

- **ASNR Alzheimer's Imaging Research Program** funds imaging-based research that advance our understanding of Alzheimer's disease, help identify new treatment strategies, provide information to improve care for people with dementia, and further our knowledge of brain health and disease prevention;
- **Trainee Research Award in Neuroradiology** supports and fosters high-quality, in-depth neuroradiology research among trainees (residents and fellows) who are committed to neuroradiology;
- **Scholar Award in Neuroradiology Research** for investigators in the early stage of their career (including junior faculty) to enhance competency in areas important to the future of Neuroradiology, including health services research, physiological imaging and Interventional Neuroradiology;
- **Research Scientist Award in Neuroradiology** provides research opportunities for PhD investigators to advance the science of Neuroradiology;
- **Comparative Effectiveness Research Award** supports investigators in the generation and synthesis of evidence that compares the benefits and harms of diagnostic imaging methods or interventions to prevent, diagnose, treat and monitor a clinical condition or to improve the delivery of care;
- **Outstanding Contributions in Research** recognizes neuroradiologists who demonstrate consistent excellence and lifelong accomplishment in basic or clinical neuroscience research, particularly funded research from the NIH, NSF, March of Dimes, etc.;
- **Women in Neuroradiology Leadership Award** recognizes mid-career women with demonstrated experience and promise for leadership in Neuroradiology and/or Radiology. Sponsored in collaboration with the AAWR and ACR.
- **ASNR/RSNA Research Scholar Grant**- This jointly sponsored biennial award is the result of a collaborative effort between the Foundations of the ASNR and RSNA. The goal is to fund additional research in Neuroradiology and to help prepare the next generation of neuroradiology researchers to become fully funded physician-scientists with their own research programs.
- **ARRS/ASNR Scholarship**-The biennial jointly sponsored American Roentgen Ray Society (ARRS)/ASNR Scholarship aims to establish the recipient as an independent investigator in the field of Neuroradiology and to collect preliminary data that could lead to further funding through established mechanisms such as the NIH. This scholarship program is open to junior full-time faculty members (below the associate professor level) specializing in Neuroradiology.
